Science time with Simon... Expanding a balloon using chemistry

What did we learn?

We learned a simple chemistry trick that we can try with household materials. We also learned that some materials react differently when mixed with other items. (I.E. acids & bases)



Explanation...

Once the baking soda (base) dropped and made contact with the vinegar (acid), it created a chemical reaction, which produces carbon dioxide. This gas rises and fills the balloons.

IN JEANETTE'S KITCHEN

Mac & Cheese with Veggies and Split Peas

- 15 mL (1tbsp) butter
- 15 mL (1 tbsp) canola oil
- 1 onion, diced
- 2 cloves of garlic, minced
- 250 mL (1 cup) zucchini, diced
- 250 mL (1 cup) cauliflower, chopped
- 250 mL (1 cup) spinach, chopped
- 250 mL (1 cup) red split peas, uncooked
- 45 mL (3 tbsp) flour
- 1 can evaporated milk
- 250 mL (1 cup) cheddar cheese, grated
- 60-125 mL grated parmesan

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 F
2. Melt butter and oil in a large pot or pan on medium heat
3. Saute vegetables until tender crisp
4. Add flour and combine well. Cook for 1 min
5. Stir in evaporated milk and cheddar cheese. Mix well. Stir until thickened, set aside
6. Meanwhile, cook macaroni and split peas according to package
Note: You should be able to boil them together until noodles are tender and peas are soft
7. Drain pasta and split peas and mix with sauce. Add milk if mixture is too thick.
8. Place in greased casserole dish
9. Top with parmesan cheese
10. Bake for 20 mins.
